GENERAL MANAGER'S MESSAGE: INVESTING IN OUR WATER SYSTEM

As we look ahead to the coming seasons, I'd like to share an update on several important Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) that are underway or on the horizon. These investments are essential to maintaining a safe, reliable water system for our community—both today and into the future.

This spring and summer, we will begin rehabilitation of the Juniper Mountain Booster Station, which provides consistent water pressure to homes at the higher elevations. The existing equipment has reached the end of its service life, and this project will replace key mechanical and electrical components to ensure continued reliability.

Also this summer, we'll be undertaking a significant water and sewer line replacement project on Klosters Court. Much of our underground infrastructure dates back to the original 1960s system, and this work will not only replace aging materials but also improve water flow for fire protection in the area. Design is complete, and we expect construction to begin following contract execution and permitting.

Looking to the fall, we are planning to install a backup generator at the AME well. This will allow the well to continue operating during power outages, strengthening our system's resilience during emergencies or peak demand periods.

Further ahead, we are preparing for a major investment in water storage tank replacements, with construction anticipated to begin in 2027. These upgrades will address aging infrastructure and ensure we have adequate storage capacity to serve the community reliably for decades to come.

We understand that construction can be disruptive at times, and we appreciate your patience as we carry out these important improvements. Each of these projects reflects our ongoing commitment to delivering safe, dependable water service to Alpine Meadows.

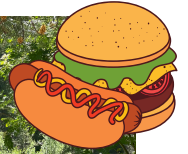

Park Passes Now Available - Same Great Price!

Great news for Alpine Springs residents—park passes are now available for purchase, and prices remain unchanged! In fact, the District has maintained the same park pass rate since 2023, making this an affordable and valuable investment for you and your family.

We're also excited to share that, thanks to a lighter winter season, our team is working hard to open the park ahead of Memorial Day. With an early spring already underway, it's the perfect opportunity to get outside and start enjoying everything the park has to offer.

If you haven't purchased your pass yet, please note that we've transitioned to a fully web-based system. You can conveniently purchase your park pass anytime by visiting the District's website at alpinesprings.org. We look forward to seeing you at the park this season!

- Single User Day Pass (only available to Alpine property owners) - \$20
- Family Day Pass (only available to Alpine property owners) - \$40
- Daily Guest Fee (Guests who are NOT staying at the home of the pass holder when accompanied by the pass holder) - \$5.00 per child - \$10 per adult Day Pass, now payable through a QR code posted at the park bulletin board and restrooms.
- Alpine Resident Family Season Pass (Property Owners and Long-term Renters) - \$200
- Non-Resident Family Season Pass (Nonresident Passes restricted to those that held a season pass the previous year) - \$300

Firewise Community: As a reminder, Alpine Meadows is a firewise community and this means you may qualify for insurance reductions. If your insurance provider recognizes firewise communities, you may be asked to provide a certificate of recognition. Defensible Space Inspections and Green Waste Clean-Up!

This year (season) the North Tahoe Fire Protection District (NTFPD) will be performing Curbside defensible space inspections throughout Alpine Meadows. With the goal of inspecting all residential properties to reduce the impact of wildland fires. Property inspections will help educate residents on needed defensible space around their homes and structures. NTFPD will provide homeowners with a report by mail of the findings along with additional educational materials to help them comply with local and state requirements. Doing your defensible space early is a great way to obtain a fully compliant A+ report. Defensible space is required by law, and many homeowner insurance policies, and as such Placer County can follow up with enforcement action for egregious violations. Residents can also schedule a thorough complete property walk around with NTFPD staff by reaching out directly to NTFPD. Additional information on defensible space and the inspection program can be found on the NTFPD’s website: ntfire.net/defensible-space-program .

To help you prepare for the Defensible Space inspections consider ordering a green waste dumpster from TTSD. Green waste dumpsters allow you to dispose of branches, tree needles, and cones completely by removing them from your property. TTSD offers a 6-yard Green Waste only dumpster delivered to your door at a special rate for District Residents at the rate of \$171.29. Call TTSD directly to order (530) 583-7800.

Billing and Payment Options

Did you know you don't have to wait until your annual bill arrives to make a payment?

Many customers choose to spread payments throughout the year. ASCWD can help you set up a schedule that works best for you—whether monthly, quarterly, or semiannually. Just contact the District office to explore your options.

Billing reminders:

- Annual bills are issued July 1
- Payment is due by August 31
- A grace period extends to September 14
- A 10% late penalty applies after the grace period

Please make sure we have your current billing address on file to avoid missed bills and penalties. If needed, payment plans are available but must be set up with the District by September 14, with your first payment submitted at that time.

New! Online Credit Card Payments Now Available: Starting this year, you can pay your bill online by visiting www.alpinesprings.org and clicking “Pay My Bill.” A secure portal will guide you through the process. Please note, a 2.25% service fee applies to credit card payments.

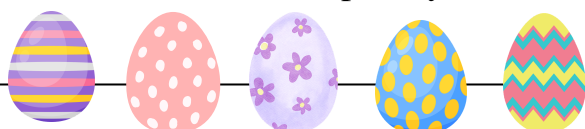
You can still pay by credit card in person or over the phone, and ACH payments remain available with no additional fees.

PROTECTING YOUR WATER: TIME FOR ANNUAL BACKFLOW TESTING

What is backflow? Under normal conditions, water flows in one direction—from the Alpine Springs County Water District system, through your service line, and into your home’s plumbing. However, under certain conditions, water can reverse direction. This is called backflow.

Backflow occurs when non-potable (non-drinking) water or other substances flow backward through a cross-connection and enter the clean water supply. This can introduce contaminants into your home’s drinking water or even the public water system, posing serious health risks. Backflow prevention devices are designed to stop this from happening—helping protect both your household and the entire community’s water supply.

Spring and summer are the perfect time to schedule your annual backflow device test and help keep our community’s drinking water safe.

Many homes in Alpine Meadows are equipped with backflow prevention devices. Not sure if you have one? Just contact the District—we’re happy to help you determine if your property requires testing.

Backflow testing is required every year under state and county regulations, as well as the Alpine Springs County Water District Cross-Connection Control Ordinance (2-88). These devices play a critical role in preventing contamination from entering the public water system.

To stay in compliance, please have your device tested by a certified backflow assembly tester with a valid Cal-Nevada AWWA certification. If you need assistance finding a qualified tester, the District maintains a list of certified professionals in the area—just reach out to us for a referral.

If your device does not pass the test, repairs must be completed promptly, followed by a retest. Once your device passes, the following documentation must be submitted to the District:

- Field test and maintenance report
- Copy of the tester’s current certification
- Gauge calibration report

In many cases, your tester will submit these documents on your behalf but all required paperwork must be received by the District no later than August 1 each year, confirming the test was completed within the previous 12 months.

Please note: Per the Placer County Department of Health Services, failure to comply with these requirements may result in water service interruption to protect the public water system from potential contamination. If you have any questions or need assistance, don’t hesitate to contact the District at (530) 583-2342—we’re here to help.

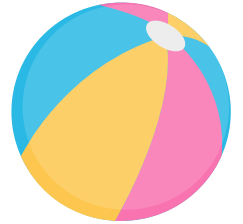
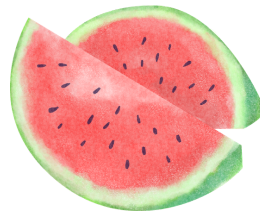
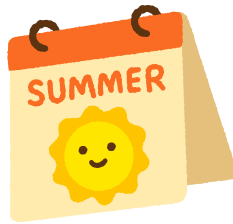
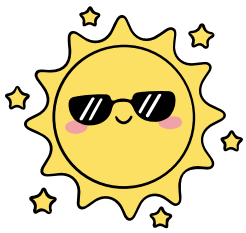
Board meetings are now offered in a hybrid format - both in person and available to view virtually via zoom. Upcoming Board Meetings are:
