DWIGHT STEELE MEMORIAL

The District and the Greenbelt Commission have created a memorial honoring Dwight Steele, former member of the District Board of Directors and Greenbelt Commission, noted local environmental activist, lawyer and friend, who passed away on July 11, 2002, to construct a memorial at the Alpine Meadows Community Park. The memorial will be dedicated July, 9, 2004 at 12:30 pm at the Park. All are welcome (with or without a park pass) to come and visit with Mrs. Steele and friends at the memorial and remember Dwight and his work.

DEFENSIBLE SPACE PROGRAM

The Alpine Meadows Fire Department (AMFD) is in high gear now that fire season is upon us. Mr. Tom Bass, AMFD Volunteer Firefighter has been selected to perform the defensible space inspections this year. Tom will be driving the fire engine and personally (or is that personably?) visiting each of your residences, so he will be hard to miss. We understand he likes warm chocolate chip cookies and cold milk.

CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

You will soon be receiving in the mail, a consumer confidence report (CCR) from the District. This report will detail the water quality of each of the water sources that the District currently utilizes for potable water. Because of the rather technical nature of this Federal law requirement, it can sometimes be confusing. If, after you receive the CCR, you have any questions regarding the content please feel free to contact the District.

DISTRICT REVENUES THREATENED

The District faces a budget crunch during the next several fiscal years. The Governor and the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) have agreed on a proposed ballot initiative that would shift a percentage of ad valorem property tax revenues from special districts to the State. In summary, the proposed initiative would shift 40% of ad valorem property tax revenues from enterprise districts and 25% of ad valorem property tax revenues from non-enterprise districts to the State. Fire, police, hospital/healthcare and library districts are exempt from the proposed shift. Multi-service districts, such as ASCWD, will have revenue from their non-enterprise and enterprise functions shifted proportionally. In the District's case, this could mean a reduction in property tax revenues of up to \$150,000 per year. To be enacted, the proposal must first be passed by a 2/3 majority of the State Senate and Assembly and then by the voters in the November election. If the proposal does not pass, the shift from special districts to the State could be greater or, if the proposed LOCAL initiative passes, zero. The District is developing contingency plans to deal with this potential revenue shortfall; these plans will probably include reducing expenses, postponing capital projects and increasing rates for AM residents.

ANNUAL BILLING - COMING TO A POST OFFICE BOX NEAR YOU!!!

It's that time of the year again. You soon will be seeing the District staff walking your neighborhood locating and reading your water meter. We have a new meter reader this year. His name is Mike Crean. Mike is a resident of the valley and we are glad to have him on staff. However, this means that shortly after Mike's visit, you will be visited via the US Postal Service with a bill from the District. Oh Happy Days!

UPCOMING ELECTION

Two seats on the Board of Directors will be up for grabs this November. The terms of President Tom Bass and Director Jon Northrop will be expiring.
